***Delta Genomics sells genotyping services to global genomics company; secures improved genomics servicing deal for Canadian livestock producers and researchers***

EDMONTON, Alberta - Delta Genomics Centre (Delta) has sold its genotyping services in an asset sale to Neogen Canada Inc. (Neogen Canada), a subsidiary of Neogen Corporation (NASDAQ: NEOG). With the acquisition, Delta's laboratory operations will continue under Neogen Canada and become Neogen's fifth animal genomics laboratory worldwide. The acquisition will help ensure more affordable genomics services to drive greater adoption of genomic technologies throughout the Canadian livestock industry.

"This is an excellent opportunity for the Canadian Livestock industry," says Graham Plastow, Delta's board chair. "The sale of our genomics services to Neogen Canada will provide us with extra resources to support the development of value-added genomics tools for our industry while maintaining high quality genomic services for our clients."

Neogen Canada will maintain its operations in Edmonton, Alberta and Delta Genomics will continue its mission to improve the sustainability, profitability and competitiveness of the Canadian livestock industry. Delta Genomics' CEO Michelle Miller is named the new general manager of Neogen Canada and will continue to work with the Delta Genomics board of directors to support customers during the transition.
